Individual members as well as all professionals from a member centre are able to get RIMS Annual Conference registration fee at a special reduced member price.

A number of Special Interest Groups (SIG) have been established. The groups meet at least once a year during RIMS annual conference. The SIGs also organise professional annual in-between workshops, which are supported financially by RIMS. For SIG in-between workshops, the member centres' professionals are offered one free hotel night and free meals for such occasion.

Some of the Special Interest Groups have published papers or pamphlets on important MS issues. These are distributed among RIMS members.

RIMS offers between three to five fellowships annually, each of one week duration and with a fellowship of 1000 €. Fellows are expected to identify themselves as representing a RIMS member centre (or as individual RIMS membership) prior to application.

The fellowship is available to young European professionals, preferably non-doctors, in order to facilitate their training in Multiple Sclerosis related rehabilitation amongst RIMS member centres. The goal of the programme is to promote the multidisciplinary approach to rehabilitation in MS and encourage the exchange of information and professional growth amongst those working in the field of MS.

RIMS is an active network for MS professionals and Centres and membership enabled access to the resources of the network, facilitates study-visits and exchange of best practise together with other skill enhancing activities.

1 RIMS

1.1 Administration

RIMS is managed by an Executive Board, which according to the bylaws is composed of eight elected officers, including the President, the Secretary and the Treasurer.

Dr Judith Lutz continued to act as SIG Coordinator and producer of our newsletter Network.

Brita Loevendahl was in charge of membership issues. Dr Claudio Solaro continued as Treasurer. A new function was created: Vicky Matthews served as web editor.

2 Special Interest Groups

The Executive Board has established a number of Special Interest Groups (SIG). These groups aim to promote research and improve the management of Persons with MS and their caregivers. Traditionally, a short workshop takes place during the RIMS annual conference and intensive "in-between" meetings of 1.5 - 2 days take place between conferences. During "in-between" SIG meetings at one of the members centres across Europe, there are scientific and clinical presentations on a chosen topic as well as free presentations. A clinical or practical session (e.g. patient cases, demonstration of technology; visit to a centre) is also organised.

A new SIG on Patient education started with Dr. Christoph Heesen, D, as Chair and Dr. Alessandra Solari, I, as Co Chair. The new SIG had its first meeting in January 2010.

The SIGs reported their in-between meetings to the Executive Board at the occasion of the RIMS-ECTRIMS Conference in Gothenburg.

RIMS SIG Patient Education (a triple SIG) first meeting, Hamburg, Germany, 22-23 January 2010: A review of the strategies allowing joint decision making in various European countries and a consensus finding discussion on how best to develop and implement information and educational interventions in PwMS.

SIG Bladder, Bowel and Sexual dysfunctions meeting, Melsbroek, Belgium 20-21 March 2010: Development of guidelines for bowel management with a review of literature, presentation from each centres of bowel management protocol, discussion of questionnaire preliminary results and definition of practical organization of guidelines.

SIG Bladder, Bowel and Sexual Dysfunction, Melsbroek, Belgium, 11 September 2010: Guidelines for bowel management: Review of literature on Pub med.

SIG Psychology and Neuropsychology, Tllinn, Estonia, 9-10 April 2010: Overview of the last year in psychology and neuropsychology of MS and work on the development of a manual for managing cognitive problems.

SIG Mobility, Prague, Czech Republic 20-21 May 2010: focused on goal setting and outcome measures as well as different contemporary European treatment approaches. In addition, first results of the multicentre walking study were presented and discussed.

3 Annual conference 2010

RIMS Annual Conference 2010 was organized as a joint RIMS-ECTRIMS conference in Gothenburg, 13-16 October. RIMS topics with two major RIMS sessions were "Progress in MS rehabilitation" and "Cognitive and behavioural aspects in MS". The RIMS sessions were very well attended.

At the RIMS booth, we had the banner, the brochure, USB with RIMS logo, a kitchen dish cloth with RIMS logo. Also a power point based game, "Guess Occupation", was modified for RIMS purposes.

All accepted abstracts were published in *Multiple Sclerosis Journal, in the supplement of the October 2010 Issue* (S7-S352).

The ECTRIMS "RIMS Award" for best Poster was nominated and awarded 500 euro's. The award was given to N. Hogan, a PhD student supervised by Susan Coote (Ireland), for her poster on interventions for balance: "Comparing the effects of group and individual physiotherapy on fatigue and Health Related QoL in people with MS".

4 Fellowship program

RIMS offers up to three to five fellowships annually, each with a duration of one week and a fellowship of 1000 € to facilitate their training in Multiple Sclerosis related rehabilitation within RIMS member centres. The goal of the programme is to promote the multidisciplinary approach to rehabilitation in MS and to encourage the exchange of information and professional growth for those working in the field of MS. Fellows are expected to identify themselves as representing a RIMS member centre (or as individual RIMS membership) prior to application.

In 2010, altogether three followers participated the program:

- National MS Center Melsbroek, Belgium, May 3-7, 2010 (Riccardo Verza)
- Masku Neurological Rehabilitation Center, Finland, from 30 May 6 June 2010 (Irene Bartolome Gomez and Laura Garcia Ruano)

According to their feedback, the experience was very good both for the centres and the fellowship students.

5 RIMS Partnership Work

Booklet on Rehabilitation Recommendations

The European MS Platform (EMSP) asked Thomas Henze to organize a follow-up of their high-quality booklet on "Recommendations on Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Multiple Sclerosis in Europe" (2004). Cooperating authors are mostly RIMS members contributing their extensive knowledge to this comprehensive overview on modern MS rehabilitation issues which will be published in 2011.

Nursing Survey

Participation with EMSP and IOMSN to implement an European survey of MS nursing in Spain, Italy, Poland, Germany, Finland, Czech Republic and UK. Data were collected in 2009, with results being available in 2010. The results were reported during ECTRIMS 2010.

Joint Meeting with the SIRN (Italian rehabilitation neurology society) was organised in Palermo, 22-24 April 2010.

6 Marketing and Advertising

New RIMS advertising material was prepared during the year: USB with RIMS logo and a kitchen cloth with logo "Good Practise" were available and distributed to members at General Assembly as well as visitors of the RIMS booth during the ECTRIMS-RIMS conference. Also, at the booth we had a special "Guess Occupation Game".

In General Assembly October 2010, the new subtitle for RIMS logo was introduced: RIMS Rehabilitation in MS - European Network for best practice and research.

7 Financial support

The Executive Board continued planning new tools for marketing and advertisement purposes.
